

Introduction to Psychological Astrology

Part II: The Relationship of Planets, Signs and Houses

The meaning of the planets, houses and zodiac will be reviewed. In addition this class will cover the angles of the chart and the qualities and elements of the signs. Aspects between the planets will be introduced. Students with a basic understanding of the meaning of the planets and houses are welcome to participate even if they have not taken Part I of An Introduction to Psychological Astrology.

3. To identify the qualities and elements of the zodiac signs and how the expression of a planet changes based upon the quality or element.
4. To identify the aspects and how the expression of a planet changes based upon the aspect to another planet.
